PETER: I think we need to pray as we are working on the presentation


MR. JOHNSON: Forget prayer; we need more hands; get me Francis and another person you know can work overtime. We need to put more effort into the presentation to win the contract.

MRS. JOHNSON: We have been praying for them since, yet no changes. We counseled them and reproved them, yet there were no changes.


MR. JOHNSON: My dear, we will not relent. Please, let's go back to bed. I must get to the office early in the morning.
